

Benin at a Glance

Background: Present day Benin was the site of Dahomey, a West African kingdom that rose to prominence in about 17... and over the next two and a half centuries became a regional power, largely based on its slave trade. Coastal areas of Dahomey began to be controlled by the French in the second half of the 19th century; the entire kingdom was conquered by 1A95. French Dahomey achieved independence in 197...; it changed its name to the Republic of Benin in 19V9.

A succession of military governments ended in 1947 with the rise to power of Mathieu KEREKOU and the establishment of a government based on Marxist-Leninist principles. A move to representative government began in 19A9. Two years later, free elections ushered in former Prime Minister Nicephore SOGLO as president, marking the first successful transfer of power in Africa from a dictatorship to a democracy. KEREKOU was returned to power by elections held in 1941 and 7..., though some irregularities were alleged. KEREKOU stepped down at the end of his second term in 7... and was succeeded by Thomas YAYI Boni, a political outsider and independent, who won a second five-year term in March 7... Patrice TALON, a wealthy businessman, took office in 7... after campaigning to restore public confidence in the government.



Economy - overview: The free market economy of Benin has grown consecutively for three years, averaging about \circ ? annually since $\gamma \cdot \gamma \xi$, but its close trade links to Nigeria expose Benin to risks from volatile commodity prices. Cotton is a key export commodity; high prices supported export earnings, but prices have fallen. Inflation had subsided, but probably accelerated in $\gamma \cdot \gamma \gamma$.

During the first [¬] months of President TALON's administration, electrical supply, which has hampered Benin's economic growth, increased and blackouts have been reduced. Private foreign direct investment is small, and foreign aid accounts for the majority of investment in infrastructure projects.

Benin's '...' privatization policy continues in telecommunications, water, electricity, and agriculture. Benin has appealed for international assistance to mitigate piracy against commercial shipping in its territory. Pilferage has significantly dropped as the Port of Cotonou is still making progress towards implementing the International Ship and Port Facility Security (ISPS) Code in an effort to remain competitive. Projects included in Benin's γ million Millennium Challenge Corporation (MCC) compact (γ ...) were designed to increase investment and private sector activity by improving key institutional and physical infrastructure. The four projects focused on access to land, access to financial services, access to justice, and access to markets (including modernization of the port). The Port of Cotonou is the largest component of Benin's economy with revenues projected to account for more than ξ .

Realizing its economic potential requires further efforts to infrastructure upgrades, stemming corruption, and expanding access to foreign markets in Nigeria and neighboring landlocked countries. In September $\land \circ \circ$, Benin signed a MCC second Compact for $\$" \circ \circ$ million that is designed to strengthen the national utility service provider, attract private sector investment, fund infrastructure investments in electricity generation and distribution, and develop off-grid electrification for poor and unserved households. In order to raise growth, Benin plans to attract more foreign investment, place more emphasis on tourism, facilitate the development of new food processing systems and agricultural products, encourage new information and communication technology, and establish Independent Power Producers (IPP). In April $\land \cdot \lor$, the IMF approved a three year $\$\circ \cdot \cdot \textdegree$ million Extended Credit Facility agreement to maintain debt sustainability and boost donor confidence.




Benin GDP Annual Growth Rate

The Gross Domestic Product (GDP) in Benin expanded $3,4 \cdot$ percent in the third quarter of 7.14 over the same quarter of the previous year. GDP Annual Growth Rate in Benin averaged $2, \circ$ percent from 1971 until 7.14, reaching an all time high of $9,9\circ$ percent in the fourth quarter of 1941 and a record low of $-2,9\circ$ percent in the fourth quarter of $1940\circ$.




Benin GDP per capita


